What is EMEA?

Erasmus Mundus Europe Asia (EMEA) is a scholarship programme designed to fund academic mobility of students and staff from Bangladesh, China, India, Nepal and Pakistan to Europe. The programme is part of a larger EU-programme (Erasmus Mundus Action 2) with the aim to promote institutional cooperation and mobility activities between Europe and other parts of the world.

Who can apply?

The EMEA scholarships are open for mobility of individuals from universities in Bangladesh, China, India, Nepal and Pakistan to the EU. Applicants must have finished at least one year of study and must belong to one of the *target groups*.

Target group 1

Nationals of Bangladesh, China, India, Nepal and Pakistan registered at one of the Asian universities in the EMEA partnership.

Scholarships are available for academic/administrative staff, and students/researchers on undergraduate, master, doctoral and post-doctoral levels.

Target group 2

Nationals of Bangladesh, China, India, Nepal and Pakistan registered at a higher education institution that is not included in the EMEA partnership, or having obtained a university degree or equivalent at a higher education institution in one of these countries.

Scholarships are available for students/researchers on master, doctoral and post-doctoral levels. For doctoral level, there are only scholarships available for exchange studies, not for a full degree.

Target group 3

Nationals of Bangladesh, China, India, Nepal and Pakistan who are in particularly vulnerable situations, for social or political reasons.

Scholarships are available for students on undergraduate and master levels.

How long is the duration of the scholarship?
